


Exhibition: Forest Dreaming, Part 1

Saturday 15 April – Sunday 21 May (Part 2. Sat 10 June - Sun 16 July) Admission free

Workshop: Framing the Forest with Vanland


Monday 24 April onwards, over evenings, weekends and half term Admission free. Booking essential





Talk: Peter Randall-Page on the Eden Project's new building Saturday 24 June, 11am Admission £3 (conc. £2). Booking essential


Sculptor Peter Randall-Page talks on his collaboration with Grimshaw Architects on the design of the Eden Project's new education building.

Peter's practice has often been informed by botanical form and, by following the kind of spiral pattern found in pinecones and sunflower heads, the dimensions of roof timbers were dramatically reduced.

Peter is now working on a 100 tonne carving for the central chamber of the building.

Artist residencies: Seung-hyun Ko and Anke Mellin Haldon Belvedere

Work made by Seung-hyun Ko, Anke Mellin and Ben Taffinder during last summer's artist residencies in the grounds of Haldon Belvedere can be seen on Sundays and Bank Holidays 1.30 – 5.30pm from 16 April until the end of October when the tower is also open to the public.

Commission: Robert Kilvington Mamhead viewpoint

CCANW has advised the Forestry Commission on the commissioning of new seating at the Mamhead viewpoint. The craftsman Robert Kilvington from Barnstaple has created a spectacular 8 metre long curving bench out of oak.

The Haldon Forest

The Forest lies on a ridge south of Exeter and dominates the skyline for miles around. It covers an area of 3500 acres (1400 hectares) mostly planted with coniferous woodland, but encompassing areas of broadleaved trees, streams and dramatic views to Dartmoor, Exeter and the Exe estuary. Part of the forest is designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest as it supports an exceptional range of birds of prey, a population of breeding nightjars and communities of butterflies.

The Project Space is adjacent to the new Haldon Forest Gateway car park, between Exeter Racecourse and Haldon Belvedere, 5 miles (8km) south of Exeter. OS Grid ref. SX884849.

Travel

From the A38 Devon Expressway (Exeter to Plymouth road) take the turning to Exeter Racecourse and the signs to the Forest Park. From the A380 (Exeter to Torquay road) follow the brown tourist signs for Haldon Belvedere.

The 360 bus from Exeter Bus Station to Bridford stops at Haldon Belvedere, a 20 minute walk from the Project Space.
