

year-long Festival of Timber in Const Wood Culture will explore the beauty usefulness and sustainability of wo focus on the contemporary uses of timin architecture and design. Over the Sum we will present a major exhibition on the ten best contemporary timber buildings in Europe and this will then tour to the Architecture Centre, Bristol and other venues. Exhibitions will provide the nucleus for a series of seminars, residencies and workshops. This programme is supported with grant aid from South West Woodland Renaissance.

Spring we will also organise the first forum to launch the University of the Trees. This long-term project is being developed by Shelley Sacks of the Social Sculpture Research Unit at Oxford Brookes University in collaboration with groups and networks

The Forestry Commission's pioneering activity trails at Haldon provide 20 miles of and horse riders, including play and sensory trails. The Forest lies on a ridge south of Exeter and dominates the skyline for miles around. It covers an area of 3500 acres dramatic views to Dartmoor, Exeter and the Exe estuary. Part of the forest is designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest.
