has been leading the way in exploring our changing relationship to nature through the arts.



Wood Works: 13 Years of the Wood Studio, Helsinki Saturday 26th January -Sunday 30th March

Wood Works features beautiful models, photographs and plans of nineteen striking wooden buildings, including saunas, pavilions, a lookout tower and a café. All have been produced over the past thirteen years by students of the ground-breaking Wood Studio from the Department of Architecture at Helsinki University of Technology.

Timber Talent South West: Sustainable Architecture for the 21st Century

Saturday 26th April - Sunday 13th July

One of six exhibitions organised during the Wood Culture programme, Timber Talent features CCANW's selection of sixteen of the most inspiring examples of the use of timber in contemporary UK architecture. Its South West focus includes both recent innovative timber buildings from the region, and South West practices creating

striking timber structures elsewhere in the UK.

These projects - including sixixis' 'Rolling Summer House' (left), the Eden Project's 'Core' and SCDLP Architects' award-winning 'Dairy House' - will be documented with beautiful images and early sketches, study models and short films.
