Centre for Contemporary Art and the Natural World

CCANW is an innovative educational charity which uses the Arts to explore new understandings of our changing place within Nature. It operates a Project Space in Haldon Forest Park, near Exeter, part of an exciting new partnership with the Forestry Commission.

During 2007-8, it has organised the *Wood Culture* festival, celebrating the beauty, usefulness and sustainability of wood and exploring its many uses in contemporary architecture and design.

The festival has revolved around five exhibitions. The panels on display here are a selection from 'Inspiring Futures', an exhibition on 12 of the most inspiring new timber buildings in Europe. The current exhibition at CCANW, 26 April – 13 July, features our selection of 16 new timber buildings made or designed in the South West and goes on to the Architecture Centre, Bristol 9 September – 9 November. All these exhibitions are available to be shown at other places.
